THE GAME: The Archbishop Moeller football team travels north to Dublin Coffman High School in Columbus, for a neutral site contest with the Cleveland St. Ignatius Wildcats on Saturday night. This will mark the 5th meeting all-time between the Crusaders and the Wildcats. The Crusaders radio call will be broadcasted live on the LetsGoBigMoe.com with Jeff Schnedl on play-by-play and Rob Ebel as the color analyst of ESP Media.

SERIES HISTORY: The Crusaders and the Wildcats will be meeting for the 5th time on Saturday night. The Wildcats hold a 4-0 advantage in the all-time series. The Wildcats and the Crusaders last met in 1995 at the University of Cincinnati's Nippert Stadium, with the Wildcats being victorious by a final of 24-12.

CRUSADERS FOOTBALL ALUMNI UPDATE: Miami (OH) redshirt senior quarterback Andrew Hendrix ('10) threw for 352 yards and 3 touchdowns in the Redhawks, 29-19 loss to Akron. Hendrix was also named the Capital One Impact Performer of the Week, last week for his performance in the Redhawks 42-41 victory over UMass on October 4th Michigan State's redshirt senior Marcus Rush ('10) had two tackles in the Spartans, 45-31 victory over the Purdue Boiler-makers Rico Murray ('05) of the Hamilton Tiger-cats and Greg Jones ('07) of the Toronto Argonauts squared off against each other this past weekend. Murray accounted for 5 tackles and a forced fumble in the contest and Jones accounted for a tackle in the 34-33 victory for the Argonauts

NEXT GAME: Big Moe returns home to face off against a 2013 State Semi-finalist in the Lakewood St. Edward Eagles on Saturday, October 25th. This will mark the 6th meeting all-time between the schools. Kickoff is set for 4:00pm at Lockland Roettger Stadium. ARCHBISHOP MOELLER FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

HISTORICAL MATCH-UP: When the Crusaders and the Wildcats take the field Saturday, it will mark the meeting of the top two most successful high school football programs in the state of Ohio. The Crusaders (9) and the Wildcats (11) rank as the top two teams in the number of State Championships in football in OHSAA history. In addition the Crusaders and the Wildcats have combined to win 13 of the last 26 Division 1 State Championships dating back to 1988. The Crusaders and Wildcats have repeated as State Champions multiple times, with Cleveland St. Ignatius repeating 5 times from 1991-1995 and Archbishop Moeller repeating 3 times from 1975-1977 and repeating twice in 1979-1980 and 2012-2013.

ARCHBISHOP MOELLER-CLEVELAND ST. IGNATIUS SERIES: The Archbishop Moeller Crusaders and the Cleveland St. Ignatius Wildcats meet for the 5th time on Saturday, October 18th at Shamrock Stadium at Dublin Coffman High School. Cleveland St. Ignatius holds a 4-0 lead in a series that dates back to 1989. The Wildcats defeated the Crusaders in their first meeting, 34-28 in the Division 1 State Championship game at Ohio Stadium on November 28th, 1989. Cleveland St. Ignatius has won all three meetings since the inaugural meeting, defeating Archbishop Moeller again in the Division 1 State Championship in 1993 and in the 1994 and 1995 regular seasons.

CLEVELAND ST. IGNATIUS: The Wildcats enter the game with a 4-2 overall record. St. Ignatius is led by thirty-second year head coach Chuck Kyle and is coming off of a 41-10 win against McDowell (PA) in Cleveland last weekend. Dennis Grosel is St. Ignatius' starting quarterback and leads the team with 1023 yards passing. He is averaging 204.6 yards of total offense per game while accounting for 11 touchdowns, 10 through the air. The Wildcats running back, Chavez Perez leads the team with 250 rushing yards and with 7 rushing scores. The Wildcats are led in the receiving game by John Cook who has 27 receptions for 558 yards and 8 touchdowns on the season. Defensively the Wildcats are led by Realle Brown and Geoffery DiMassa who have combined for 63.5 tackles, 10.5 sacks and 1 interception on the season.
